



DEVOTIONAL THOUGHT

"Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not unto your own understanding; in all your ways acknowledge him, and he will make your path straight."

Proverbs 3:5.6

In the back of a dollar bill, you will find the words, "In God We trust". These words, this motto, was placed on U.S. coins largely because of the increased religious sentiment existing during the Civil War. Secretary of the Treasury, Salmon P. Chase, received many letters urging the U.S. to recognize God on coins. The first appeal came in a letter dated Nov. 13, 1861, written by Rev. M.R. Watkinson. An Act of Congress dated January 18, 1937, said mottoes on coins of the U.S. had to be approved by Congress. Congress passed this Act in April 1864. Also, "In God We Trust" first appeared on the 2-cent coin of 1864. On July 30, 1956, President Eisenhower approved a joint resolution of the 84th congress, declaring "In God We Trust," the national motto of the U.S. It first appeared on paper money in 1957.

Today, "In God We Trust," is the national motto of the U.S. I believe this should be the motto of every Seventh-day Adventist Christian. Proverbs 3:5,6, "Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not unto your own understanding; in all your ways acknowledge him, and he will make your path straight." This is the crowning proverb of all Proverbs. It summarizes everything. This proverb confronts with the question, "How seriously are we going to take our faith." I remember when I first asked myself this question. I figured that at the very least, I should: read the Bible, pray some, get involved in church work...it was the least I could do. I had heard of Christians whose faith altered their morals, modified their work patterns, changed the way they managed their money, and the way they treated others...all which seemed a little extreme to me. Later, I discovered the value of trusting God with my whole life.

The guestions I would like you to ponder this morning are, "Who do you trust?" "How much are you going to let your faith affect your life?" Choose to trust Jesus fully. You won't regret it.


